Organisation


This year we will be having a staggered start. Your staggered start date will be available from the school office from 12th July 2021.

 - Unfortunately, due to the current situation with regards to Covid 19 and following Government guidelines, we will not be able to welcome any parent into our nursery classroom this year to help settle their child. Children's entry into nursery is staggered to enable staff to spend time welcoming and settling new children.
 - For some children this will be the first time they may have been left with another person and often the first time they have been left in a larger environment. Tears on the first few days or after a couple of weeks are normal and often upset the parent more than the child. Do not worry. Your child is precious and we will take great care of them.

Children learn best when they are happy, safe and secure. The staff are there to guide and teach and to care and nurture.

School Lunches/ Snacks

- 30 hour provision
 - From the 1st day
 - You can provide a healthy packed lunch for your child (nut free)
 - Or, if required, you can purchase a school lunch at the cost of £2.20 per day
 - Dietary requirements- please complete the school form
- Every child
 - In addition every child will also get:
 - Free School Milk
 - Fruit snack
 - Dietary requirements- please complete school form



Medical Needs

- Please ensure you complete the Medical Needs Form, if your child has any known medical needs and the 'Request For School To Give Medication' form, if your child will require medication in school
 - Changes midyear: please inform your child's class teacher and the school office
 - Medicines Policy- prescription only
 - Inhalers: one to be kept in school at all times



Security: Health And Safety

- Before school
 - The Nursery gate will be opened:
 - Morning Session: Gate opens at 8.45am and closes at 9.00am
 - Collection 11.45am
 - Afternoon Session: Gate opens at 12.30pm and closes 12.45pm
 - Collection 3.30pm

Punctuality and good attendance are important from the outset. Good habits start early and are important for the rest of your child's academic career.

- Please ensure you are on time to collect your child and staff are made aware of any changes in collection prior to home time.



Security: Health And Safety

- Play equipment
 - The climbing frames and outdoor equipment are not for use before or after school for your child's safety
- Queries or concerns
 - We have an open door policy and please speak to a member of the nursery team if you have any concerns or issues
- The nursery has a duty of care to all children. If your child has any accidents or has hurt themselves, please let a member of staff aware. We are duty bound to follow up any unusual marks or injuries, and as a matter of course we will report any concerns to the safeguarding authority who may need to follow them up.

Being Prepared: Activities To Do At Home

Please work with your child so that they are able to:

- Put his/her coat on
- Recognise his/her own name
- Encourage your child to dress without help
- Manage in the toilet: use the toilet independently
 - Ask to go! The children will be allowed to go at any time
- Wash his/her hands
- Eat solid food and drink out of a cup
- Make his/her needs known: tell an adult
- Tidy toys away
